


#### Need for bioenergy deployment in the EU

- No significant reduction of energy consumption or GHG emissions in the European transport sector for the past decades;
- Market development in contrast to ambitious climate and energy targets on EU and international level;
- Bioenergy is the only option to reduce GHG emissions in the transport sector immediately — as low level blends and drop in fuels can be used in the whole vehicle fleet;
- Decade of political uncertainty more clarity now with REDIII and Fit for 55.

# The indispensable role for bioenergy and biofuels in the Green Transition

- Bioenergy is a central part of climate mitigation in Europe:
- Representing over half of the renewable energy sources used;
